


"Mamo, who are we going to help today?"

The first question asked by granddaughter Kiaerah upon arriving at the Carr's




home for her *Kids Kare* afternoon (white paper is the outline for the days activities).

So what is **Kids Kare** all about??

A visit to Salvation Army to see how this wonderful organization helps the homeless and others. Take needed items (soap, personal items, clothing, etc...) to the shelter and bring cookies for the staff baked by the children.

• Visit to Senior Care facility and meet with an individual from the church or others. Bake cookies or other goodies and draw pictures for them.

• Stop by and check out the animals at the Humane Society. Take cat/dog food, "goodies" for the staff.

Sue asked the girls what it would be like to lose your home and all of your belongings. Images were shown from recent news clips and Sue asked what could they do to help. What comforts you when you are scared?, Sue asked. The girls both like to hold one of their special stuffed animals when they are frightened. Therefore, they concluded, they should send some stuffed animals to the Japanese children to comfort them. Sue then asked a hard question, "What stuffed animal is your favorite, the one you like the most?

Both eagerly shared their special animals. Then Sue said, "would you be willing to give your favorite stuffed animal to a child in Japan?" After some agonizing moments, both girls gave Sue their favorite animals to comfort some homeless Japanese children who lost everything.

These animals along with a few other items were taken to a Christian organization, *Gleaning for the World*, where the girls were treated royally by the Gleaning people. They took them into the warehouse where the girls placed their donations with notes in to a box bound for Japan.

There were tears of joy shed then. Saying goodbye to your favorite animal and yet wanting to help others filled their hearts.
