✓ Would you believe 2 countries in less than 5 minutes? That's just enough time to meet a pair of GSSM students.

- ✓ First stop: LIBERIA
  - No, you won't be exposed to Ebola, that terrible disease that devastated thousands in Liberia and other countries.
- ✓ Meet Wellington who will graduate later this summer.
  - Wellington is a pastor of a large church in Monrovia, the capital of Liberia.
  - He is not only the senior pastor of this large church but also oversees several smaller churches. As if that is not enough.
  - He teaches in a seminary and runs a sports ministry program out of his church.







 Pastor Wellington took a little longer than normal to complete GSSM's 18-month course due to a series of crisis erupting in his region including the Ebola virus that fortunately spared Wellington and his family.



 GSSM will soon fly Wellington to Uganda where he will take his written and oral final exams administered by Barnabas Mwesiga, GSSM's African Director.


While in Uganda he will visit the slum work of Jimmy, one of GSSM's graduates. He will observe Jimmy's feeding program involving 300 children, see the slum soccer league in action where the Gospel is being presented and Biblical principles taught. Then he will sing along with the children's choir as they share the Good News through song and testimony. Wellington will also be exposed to programs reaching street children, orphans, helping the sick and elderly and watch the GSSM's Doves F.C. in action as they invite people to become Christ followers.

Traveling to the North, Wellington will meet with GSSM partner Aloysius Kyazze and observe newly planted churches in forgotten villages. He will also meet with another GSSM graduate who is working with one of the newly planted churches in a village infested with demon-possessed people. His unique sports program is breaking down barriers and people are turning to Christ and fleeing the idols that have bound them.

 Wellington will also sit down with GSSM partners and discuss sustainability...sustainability that works! ✓ Now it is time to rush to the airport and catch our flight to Zambia...

- GSSM student Hara will greet us at the airport. Hara is about half-way through GSSM's 18-month course.
- Hara works for the Zambian government overseeing about 1/3 of the country's physical education programs. He loves the Lord deeply and wants to proclaim the Gospel to his countrymen.
- Two of his close associates want to sign up for GSSM's training program in order that they, too, will be better equipped to share the Good News and develop quality programs with a strong discipleship emphasis that will, God willing, produce even more leaders.

Hara's U.S. instructor, Steve Burke, along with his son Bryan, are headed to Malawi the next door neighbor to Zambia. Burke, a soccer coach and former A.D. at Judson University, will meet a graduating student in Malawi, administer oral and written exams, evaluate the students sports ministry program established through his church, interview 10-20 prospective students, most of whom are pastors, award a diploma and sports ministry kit before the congregation of the graduate's church and meet with our partner in Malawi, Pastor Banda who graduated with honors a year ago.



Steve Burke will also meet with Hara and his two colleagues who are interested in becoming GSSM students.
