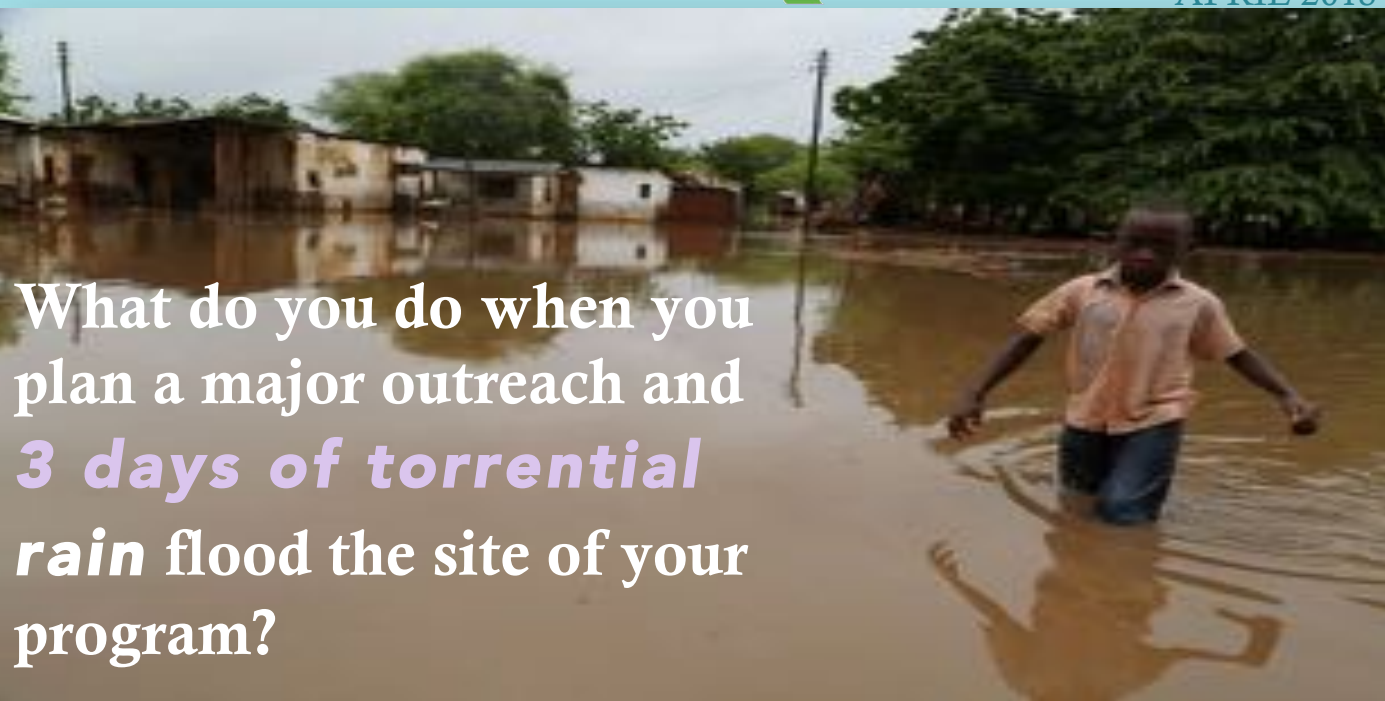

In Malawi, Africa, one of GSSM's current students helped organize a major outreach in the capital, Lilongwe. Faced with a difficult decision due to 3 days of torrential rain, the organizing committee decided to pray and seek the Lord's wisdom. Do we cancel or postpone? Following much prayer it was decided that they should go ahead in spite of the circumstances that clearly spelled disaster. Faith replaced fear and the event was held in spite of many who questioned the wisdom of going ahead under such circumstances.

And so what happened? Did the Lord misguide them? Desert them? Or what? No, instead the Lord rewarded them for their faith and trust in Him.

First of all a large group of pastors showed up to observe the outreach when only 15 at the most were expected. I would suspect that a number of the pastors who did arrive under such dire conditions concluded that this should be interesting...failure was written all over the program that was scheduled.



But faith danced around what should have been.

Nothing is impossible for God, the invited guest of honor to this outreach. Soon huge numbers of people and participants arrived not fully knowing what would transpire. After all the playing fields were flooded and unplayable.



Then a series of things began to happen.

A wealthy man in the neighborhood donated T-shirts for all of the participating teams. Then he handed them some new soccer balls. Of course the teams will be thirsty so how about some soft drinks for the competitors and lunch for the organizing committee? Later when he saw the results of the outreach this generous man asked the GSSM team to organize a similar event in his rural village and he would provide all the resources.

And the showers of blessings continued.

Since the soccer fields were flooded, the teams gathered in a shelter and played some indoor type of games which they thoroughly enjoyed even though most people would have thought that these teams would have simply packed up and gone home very disappointed. Not so.

Now for the best part!

Our GSSM student, Daniel Mwale, reported that 130 youth gave their lives to Christ as a result of the program that should have not taken place. But there is more. Forty-nine adults also accepted Christ to be their Lord and Savior. The majority of the 49 were men around 35 years of age. Most of these men are now part of the churches who supported the outreach. Men of this age are usually mature, well-established, hard working and often hold leadership positions. Amazing!



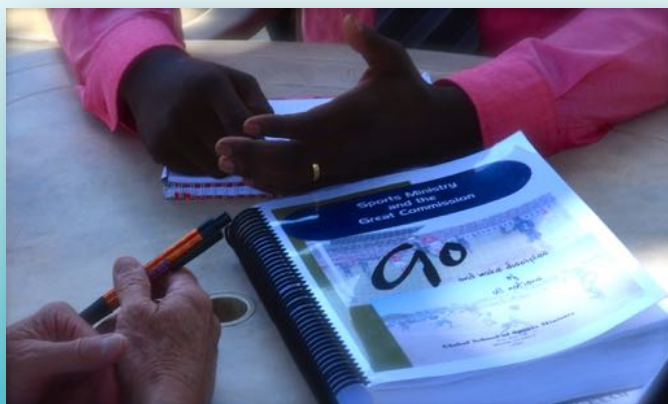


BUT WAIT...THERE'S STILL MORE!!!!
